It's that time of year once more, to dust off the helmets and shoulder pads and get down to business. The tickets are printed by a new company 'fundcrazr.com', and is run the same way as previous years.

The game is \$10 per ticket and is run for the last 10 weeks of the NFL season, beginning November 1. You have four teams listed for each of those weeks and the total scores are combined for your score. There are 25 prizes given each week (17 highest scores and 8 lowest scores) are winners. Prizes total \$2500 each week.

The tickets are sold at \$10 each and the Council profits \$2 for each ticket sold plus we will receive a bonus after the game concludes, following the distribution of funds, up to \$3 per ticket sold. This is a state wide project where proceeds are donated to Special Olympics.

### K of C Christian Refugee Relief Fund provides desperately needed aid

Having already donated more than \$3 million in humanitarian aid to persecuted Christians and other religious minorities in the Middle East, the Knights of Columbus will expand its efforts even further with a national campaign to raise funds and foster awareness of the terrible suffering of Christians and others in the Middle East.

The Knights will also announce additional details of its program to aid Christian refugees at its international convention being held August 4-6 in Philadelphia. In attendance will be archbishops from Iraq and Syria, where the violence against Christians has been particularly severe.

An exposé on the deafening silence of the international community on this issue was published in the July 26 edition of *The New York Times Magazine*: "Is This the End of Christianity in the Middle East?" It reported that extremist groups "are enslaving, killing and uprooting Christians, with no aid in sight."

In the article, which was featured on the magazine's cover, author Eliza Griswold reported that, "according to a Pew study, more Christians are now faced with religious persecution than at any time since their early history."

The Knights began its Christian Refugee Relief Fund in August 2014 with \$1 million in matching funds that was quickly met and exceeded by its members and the public. The humanitarian assistance provided has included new housing for those who have had to flee their homes, as well as support for medical facilities in areas flooded with Christian and other refugees.
