

My Dear Brother Knights, Last month, John McAleer and I attended our annual Retreat at Malvern. What a fantastic weekend it was! As hard as I try, I cannot find the words to describe the feeling of joy, spiritual well-being,

experienced. Next year's retreat should be the weekend of January 15-17, 2021. Put it on your calendar now. Below are some excerpts from the retreat.

Make Disciples, Then Mature Them

We often wonder why "The Church" doesn't do something about _____? You fill in the blank. What's your pet peeve? Who is "The Church?" You are! I am. We all are. We are the front line, in the trenches. Priests and Deacons are here to support us. Most of us feel it is up to the priests and deacons to evangelize, but it is us the church, you and me who are the makers of disciples. Think about that. Let it sink in. You are the one who has to go out and bring in new disciples and then mature them, so they can then go out and make new disciples and so on. A Mature Disciple is "all in," 100% in.

It is only a matter of degree difference between a Mature Disciple and a Disciple.

Jesus is always pushing us to be 'more' even when we do not know our potential. A Mature Disciple abhors mediocrity (coasting) or complacency, he is relentless! Committed!

It's very simple to evangelize. Don't get discouraged or think this is not you. You are a disciple, and Jesus is right beside you, with you always. So what is a disciple? A disciple is a person who knows Jesus Christ. He, or she, had a conversion; they had a personal encounter with Jesus. Their Catholic Faith is no longer just another aspect of the many things that make up their life (Church on Sunday, scouts, soccer, sports, work, parties, commitments, etc.). Before being a disciple, you had a whole array of things, duties, etc that encompassed your life, and Jesus Christ just happened to be one of them.

But then, something happens to you, and suddenly Jesus becomes the most important thing in your life. It may be jolting, life-threatening for some, or a simple nudge from God, but Jesus is now a "real" person to you, as real as your brother, sister or close friend. God is no longer just some force 'out there' - not just one of the many aspects of your life. You realize how much God loves you, no matter what you do or have done or not done. Jesus is as real as any person in your life. You had a personal encounter with Jesus. I cried at the full realization of God's love for me. You had a conversion. You had a personal encounter with Christ.

A disciple is an apprentice of Jesus. We are 'imitators' of Christ. Ask yourself, "What does it mean for me to be a disciple? What can I do to become a mature disciple? How can I grow in my Catholic Faith and love for God? A Mature Disciple makes disciples who become mature disciples and then go out and make disciples who then become mature disciples and go out..., and so on.

Four reasons why our children and grandchildren do not go to church.

1. The church does not do a good job attracting youth;

2. Our culture today is anti-religion. All religions are losing people;

3. Children and grandchildren are part of the problem;

4. You and me are part of the problem – Yeah, we sent them to Catholic school, CCD or PREP – but did we DISCIPLE them?

Earlier, I stated evangelizing can be very simple,

don't overthink it. For example, I heard many faith-centered stories on retreat. I keep a journal of miracles I see happening today, and many of these 'stories' qualify as miracles for my journal. One in particular stands out in my mind, because of its simplicity and its tremendous power. It is evangelization pure and simple.


Terry, a friend and brother Retreatant told me this story that happened years ago when his son was away at college. Terry's son was leaving the Dorm for Sunday night Mass. His roommate, sitting there playing a video game, asked, "Where are you going?" Terry's son replied, "To Mass. Wanna come?" His response, "Yeah. Sure. Why not?" And he has been going ever since. Simple. Direct. Very, very powerful! (A new disciple was made).

Your commission: Go! Make a Disciple.

Your assignment for this week: Think about being a disciple, then make a list of things you are going to do to become a Mature Disciple. As a mature disciple make a list of what you can do to make a new disciple. For example: When your children or grandchildren ask what they can get you for your birthday, Christmas, etc. Tell them a "very special gift would be for you to come to Mass with me."

In the story of the shrewd manager (Luke's Gospel Chapter16: Verses 1-13), particularly verse 10, It seems Jesus is commending the dishonesty of the manager. But actually Jesus says to his disciples (you and me) "I wish you all acted as decisively as the manager." Jesus is commending his initiative. We need to take initiative as a Mature Disciple. You need a growth plan to become a mature disciple. How can you be a mature disciple? A very good book on this topic is *Into His Likeness* by Edward Sri from Ignatius Press:
