

# Lessons from the Cicada Killer

It is a beautiful, glorious morning, this sunny day of July 20 where I sit in my backyard writing this. I'm late, a week beyond my usual deadline. My wife has been suffering with Covid-19 for a week, and I started feeling down and out with all the symptoms of a serious cold a few days ago. I'm not trying to garner your sympathy or attention, just laying the background for this canvas.



Originally, I supposed I'd just plagiarize something for this month's newsletter, because I just did not feel like writing. I came outside to relax and try and feel better. Nature has always fascinated me, and she takes my mind off negative thoughts. "Nature" is my 25-foot by 25-foot backyard on a sliver of land 25 feet by 100 feet. Not much when compared to zillions of acres in the country. But a lot happens in this tiny world out back, and today an incident occurred that got me wondering about how we trust God.

I am fascinated by the solitary digger wasp Cicada Killer or Cicada Hawk depending on where you're from. It is a large wasp that belongs to the family Crabronidae (I looked it up). The females average 2 inches long, but the males are half her size. Only the female can sting but must be highly provoked or stepped on. She only wants to sting Cicadas.

You may have seen colonies of them buzzing your lawn or your neighbor's. Go online or YouTube to learn about them. They are harmless, but many people fear them. They are curious and will zoom towards anyone walking innocently by. I was terrified by them and tried to exterminate every-last-one of them in my neighborhood years ago when I cut neighbors' lawns. Thank God for YouTube for educating me to the reality of these benign giants.

For the past week I've been watching 3 Cicada Killer males perched about 20 feet from each other in a triangle. One on our McDonald's Eastern White Pine, one on my neighbor's fence, and the other in the far corner of my neighbor's yard. Every couple of minutes two wasps engage each other or all three in short air-combat skirmishes lasting seconds. I can't tell for sure, but it looks like they head-butt each other. The males hatch first and emerge from their underground burrow a week or so before the females. These guys are waiting for the females to arrive.

I saw a female cruise by yesterday, but the numbskulls were so busy harassing each other they missed her.

Early this morning she cruised by again, but all three males were nowhere to be seen, probably sleeping in. She was investigating under my bushes and around the yard, probably looking for a nesting spot once she mates.

She flew over to my neighbor's yard and started investigating his portable outdoor firepit. It's old and she managed to crawl through a rusted-out hole in the bottom and trapped herself in there. She must have forgot how she got in, because she vigorously buzzed and clawed the top to escape, but it's covered in mesh. I wanted to go over and release her but waited to see if she could get out on her own. The three males eventually realized she was in there and went crazy zooming all around the fire pit and of course fighting each other. The female was

ferociously trying to get out. This went on for hours until she finally gave up and just sat there. The males returned to their perches, harassing each other and anything else that flew by.

I was hoping she would return to the bottom of the firepit and discover one of the many rusted-out holes and slots, avenues of escape, but she clung stubbornly to the top. In her mind this was the only way out.

I said earlier that she reminded me of how we trust God. We are like that female Cicada Killer stubbornly and senselessly clinging to our way of doing things. The steel mesh of the firepit is every problem, frustration and worry we allow to trap and suffocate us. We foolishly claw at it and pound against it again and again, falsely hoping to escape.

The rusted-out holes are the avenues of hope, love, and trust God freely gives to us, but we do not trust Him or relax enough to see them. All we need do is stop fighting God and stop our furious clawing at the "steel mesh," settle down and walk freely through the avenues of acceptance offered by our loving Father. What I mean by acceptance is being at peace and freely accepting God's will. Every prayer is answered. Problems we pray about are not always answered the way we want or expect (Is 55:8-9).
