


St Patty's Irish Night at Saint Cecilia's. The Knights showed up in force and took over two full tables. Celebrating Brother Callahan's recovery.












My Brother Knights,

Bloody Passion

Good Friday is fast approaching as Lent is fading away. Hopefully, we have moved closer to Our Lord and understand a little better, even if just a glimpse, of His tender



love for us. Keep on trucking, don't stop because lent is over. God wants you. About a month ago at our weekly bible study we were asked to research during the upcoming week the following question: Why did Jesus have to die in such a bloody mess and so much anguish? Why did He have to die the way He did?

I enjoy eating. It is my most favorite thing to do. Occasionally a nice, juicy, steak... A leg of lamb... or my all-time favorite - a rib roast cooked by my sister Clare. I'm sure you have your favorite meat, but have you ever thought about what it takes for us to enjoy that magnificent, sumptuous meal? Things must die or be sacrificed for our survival (or enjoyment).

Before it got to your plate, before it arrived neatly wrapped and packaged, that delicious meal was a live, breathing animal who was slaughtered in a bloody mess and much anguish. Not a pleasant thought while feasting on a nice roast, we should quickly lose our appetite and put down the fork.

Estimates differ, but there were 250,000 to 2 million people in Jerusalem for Passover the year Jesus suffered and died. Imagine over 200,000 yearling sheep being slaughtered for tomorrow's Passover feast. Rules specified the slaughter had to be at the Temple, within the hours of 12 to 3 P. M. on Passover Eve. The sounds of anguish, terror, and slaughter; the smells... the gallons of blood pouring out while Jesus hung dying on a cross.

The Passover sacrifice or celebration is completed the next day when the lamb is eaten. The bloody sacrifice of yesterday's slaughter is today's sumptuous feast! At the end of the meal, the leader of the Passover Seder proclaims: "It is finished." The magnitude of the imagery of the Passover Lamb with that of Jesus is overwhelming. Jesus is the Passover Lamb, and we feast on the Passover Lamb every time we receive Holy Communion. Jesus had to die in such a bloody mess and much anguish. Jesus Himself tells us this in Luke 24:26-27, 44-45.

He had to die the way He did to fulfill scripture, to form a new covenant between God and us. He had to die that way out of love for you.

For a captivating experience, and to get to know God a little better, I encourage you to go online and research the above question 'Why did Jesus have to die the way He did?', the Passover, and read Scott Hahn's short book *The Fourth Cup*.
