

# *Summa Theologica*: (Theology for Beginners)

A while back I started *The Summa*, but then quickly succumbed to what I thought at the time an arduous task. I would restart it, but not understanding anything, I would put it away. Finally deciding that I'm not smart enough to tackle this, I put it away "forever."

A few weeks ago, George Warren mentioned he was reading "A Shorter Summa" by Peter Kreeft. I thought this might be easier with the added benefit of friendly discussion. So, I purchased it and started reading. Then the same cycle occurred. I would begin, put it down, try again ... and, well you know what happens; Complete surrender, and the book gathers dust on the shelf. However last weekend, I tackled it



again with Thesaurus and Dictionary, and it is finally sinking in. I say that to encourage you to try also, because it has become most illuminating, exciting and interesting.

I read somewhere that the primary message of St. Thomas' Summa is God's love for us. I want to better understand and appreciate more God's love for me. I want a deeper personal relationship with God so I can love and know Him better. I want God to be the center of my life. I'm expecting 'The Summa' to help.

I'm studying the 'Tenth Article' of 'Question One' under the Treatise on Sacred Doctrine, "The Nature and Extent of Sacred Doctrine." The Article asks a question that can only be answered yes or no. "Whether in Holy Scripture a Word May Have Several Senses?" Can a word in Sacred Scripture have more than one meaning?

Immediately following the Article, St. Thomas poses a "No" answer. The 'Objection' states that a word in Sacred Scripture cannot have more than one meaning. It can only have its literal meaning. The reason stated is a word with many different meanings would confuse, deceive, and destroy all force of argument. Thus, there would be no argument, but only fallacies could be deduced. Sacred Scripture needs to be able to state the truth without any fallacy. Therefore, there cannot be several meanings to a word.

St. Thomas then proves the opposite with a 'Yes' answer. A word in Sacred Scripture can have more than one meaning. There is the literal (or historical) sense or meaning of the word. it can also have a spiritual or symbolic\_meaning. The word can have figurative, philosophical, allegorical, moral, anagogical, Etc. meanings.

Indeed, spiritual meaning based on literal meaning enhances and increases the text for our benefit without destroying the literal meaning.

Here is an example, Moses (literal meaning) symbolic of Christ (allegorical meaning), leading the Hebrews (literal) symbolic of the Church, Christ's Body (allegorical) through the Exodus (continued)

(literal) symbolic of salvation (allegorical), from slavery (literal) symbolic of sin (allegorical), to Pharaoh (literal) symbolic of Satan allegorical), ruler of Egypt (literal) symbolic of this fallen world (allegorical), across the Red Sea (literal) symbolic of death (allegorical), through the wilderness (literal) symbolic of Purgatory (allegorical), to the promised land (literal) symbolic of Heaven (allegorical).

An example of the anagogical or eschatological meaning would be Christ's miracles of healing the blind men symbolizing His complete healing of our spiritual blindness in Heaven's Beatific Vision.

I study and enjoy Sacred Scripture by reading God's literal word and teaching. Then I get the extra delightful bonus of the text's full richness of symbolic, spiritual, and metaphorical meaning. For me that is most wonderful. Each time I read a passage from Scripture I gain different gifts or insights based on the literal meaning. In addition, Spiritually, Figuratively, I gain the full richness of a personal dialogue with God meant just for me and my situation at that time. Thank you, Lord.
